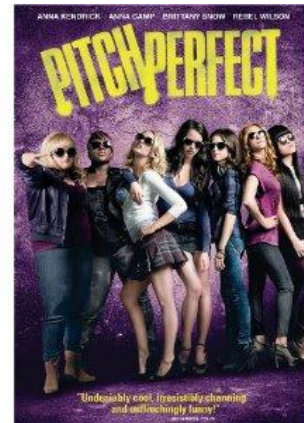
Candy Survey

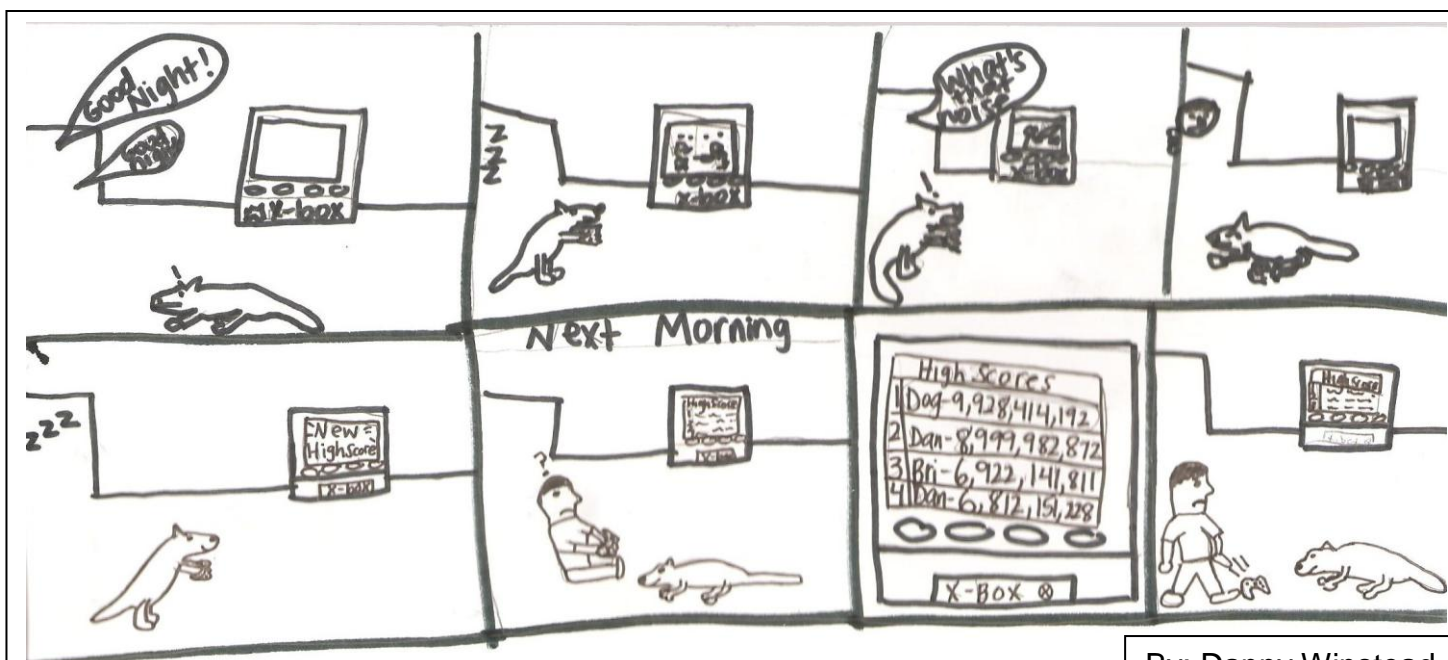

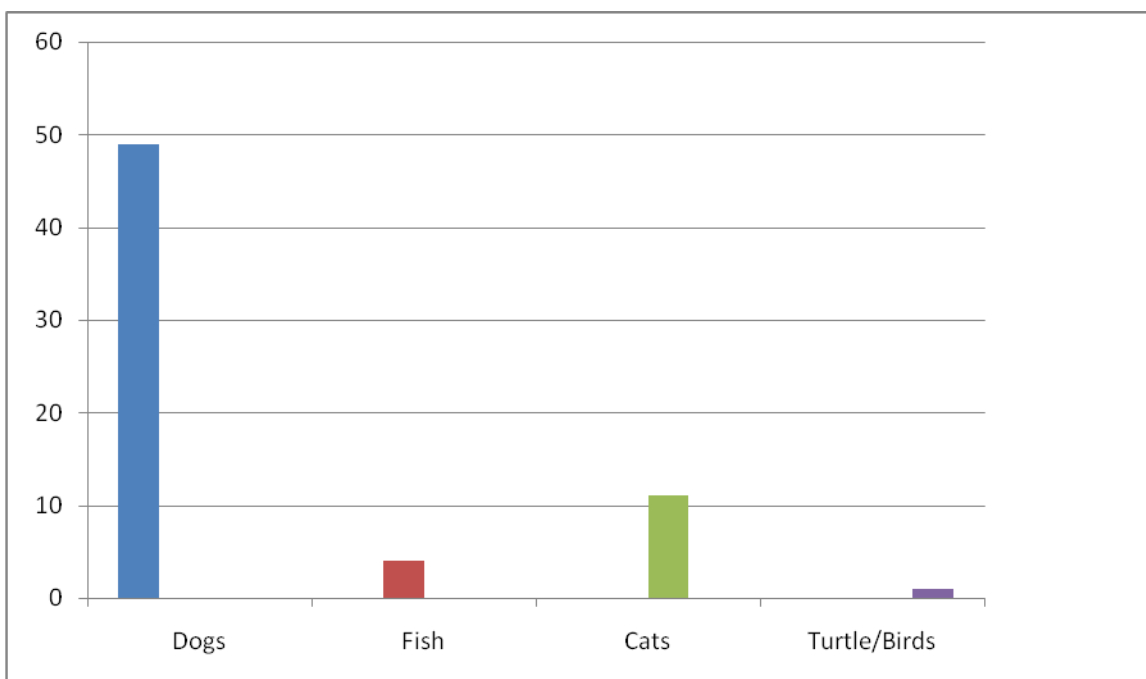
